



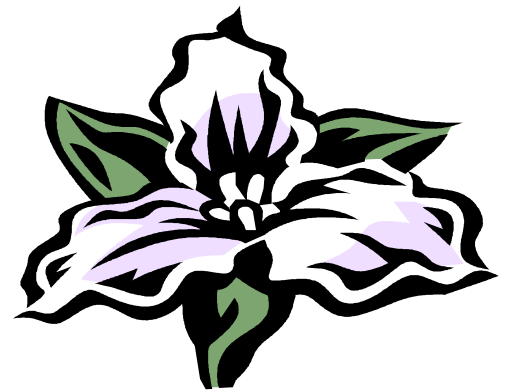
## 2010 Open Gardens Invitation

Touring private gardens and sharing ideas with fellow gardeners is one of the favorite pastimes of NPA members, and a popular benefit of membership in this unique organization. Fortunately the NPA has many generous members graciously willing to share the beauty of their personal garden creations with us. We are grateful to them for making the Open Gardens educational program a continuing success.

Last year was another successful year for the NPA Open Gardens, with 73 garden members (29 were new to the tour!) and 21 specialty nurseries joining in. The drawing for the members had 2,444 names in the basket. That's a lot of avid gardeners enjoying this benefit of their NPA membership.

Our good friends at **Wells Medina Nursery** are again sponsoring the Open Gardens. # 2010 Open Gardens Helpful Information

## I'd like to open my garden, what's next?

- First, **renew your membership**, because only current members of the NPA are eligible to be in the Open Gardens Directory.
- Then, complete both sides of the attached form. Post or email by **February 15, 2010** to:

- Do call other NPA members near you, suggest they open their gardens also, and coordinate dates. We make every effort to promote grouped gardens as a special "tours" or "duos" to increase visitors.
- Briefly describe your garden style, mentioning plants and garden features you think we'd especially enjoy.
- Provide accurate directions, especially from the nearest major cross street.
- Are there any particular difficulties we should know about (such as a steep garden site, parking limitations, obedience-challenged dogs, etc.)?
- Is your garden partially or fully handicapped accessible?

## Will anyone come?


Most likely, but consider the following:

- Centrally located gardens tend to have the most visitors. Groups of gardens get more traffic than isolated single gardens, so call your NPA friends!
- Gardens which have been open in the past develop a following and a strong word-of-mouth reputation. Visiting other gardens helps to make friends who may then visit your garden!

- Some gardens get just a handful of visitors their first year, while established gardens may get 75 + If you've just had one open garden, try again!

## Open Garden ideas and advice:

- Ask some gardening friends for help preparing your garden and during the tour. If chocolate is involved you're sure to have volunteers!
- Names of plants on markers is not necessary but do make it easier for visitors to identify a plant if you're busy with other guests.
- Post the "NPA" sign we will send you at your street. We'll know what it means but passersby won't know your garden is open. We ask that *garden tours be reserved for members, their guests and your invited guest.*
- Some folks serve light refreshments like lemonade, tea, cookies. Making water available, at least, is a good idea.
- Don't be shy. If your visitors can't find you, you'll miss the enjoyment and many compliments. You're not expected to be able to answer every question, of course. In fact, if a plant name flies right out of your head the moment someone asks about it, you're in very good company!
- If you find you have extra plants when you divide this spring, or your garden produced more seedlings than you can use, consider potting them up and giving them away to your guests free, or holding a small plant sale.
- If you're flexible about your dates, indicate on your registration form that you'd like to be paired with other gardens in your area.
- Schedule your open garden during the standard hours.

 **Register by Email!** If you prefer, you may register your garden for the 2010 Directory by email. The address is [msweeneym@comcast.net](mailto:msweeneym@comcast.net). Please put **NPA Registration** in the subject line. Here's what we need:

- Full Names(s) and Business Name, if any
- Home address and mailing address (if other than home address) / Area Code and Phone number
- Dates you would like to have your garden open, or if you're flexible, preferred month (we'll get back to you)
- Hours your garden will be open (if other than the standard 10:00 a.m.— 4:00 p.m.)
- Does your garden have easy access for people with limited mobility? Yes or No
- Description of your garden. If your garden has been open before, may we use the most recent description?
- Directions to your garden. If your garden has been open before, may we use the most recent directions?
- You can provide all of the above information to us by email on this document. We'd love that!
- Now—**This Is Important!** We will confirm that we have received your email within 72 hours. If we do not confirm, please mail us the form (to the above address), or you may be left out of the directory. Please do not assume we've received your form. Or, you can pick up the phone and call us at (206) 283-5608. It's that simple.
